

Frequently Asked Questions

CAN MY CAMPER ONLY ATTEND A PORTION OF THE WEEK? Yes, Campers can pay per day (\$25/day, \$30/field trip day). Please note that if your campers is only attending a few days of the week, we cannot guarantee that they will be able to participate in every activity we offer (boating, archery, crafts, swimming, etc) We pack in a lot of fun for the week and we only offer certain activities at certain times (weather can also effect schedule changes)

DO YOU OFFER BREAKFAST? No we do not offer breakfast, please be sure your campers has breakfast before they come. We do however, offer two snacks a day and lunch!

ON FIELDTRIP DAYS, CAN MY CAMPER JUST BUY THEIR LUNCH FROM THE VENUE? Unfortunately, time does not allow us to give campers this options. EVERYONE must pack a lunch. If they forget their lunch, we will provide them with an extra lunch that has been packed from Camp Manna.

IS A WATERBOTTLE REALLY IMPORTANT? YES!!! Please have students bring water bottles EVERY DAY!! It is highly important that students drink water throughout the day and our counselors are constantly reminding them to drink water!!

MY CHILD IS SICK, CAN I TRANSFER MY WEEK OF ATTENDANCE? Absolutely! If your child is sick or other unforeseen things happen we will be happy to transfer your week of attendance. Please notify our office ASAP to make the changes.

DOES MY CHILD HAVE TO WEAR THEIR CAMP SHIRT ON A FIELDTRIP? YES, YES, YES! Our staff is one color and our campers are in another, making it easy for campers to spot counselors and counselors to spot campers. If they forget their shirt, we will provide them with one to borrow(if available) or you will need to make arrangements to bring to them before we leave. WE realize it's a bit of a hassle to keep up with the shirt, but we try to make our field trips as safe, organized and enjoyable as possible!

WHAT IS SWIM TIME LIKE? EVERYONE must wear a life vest to do ANYTHING on lake including walking on the dock. Life vests must be checked by counselors and campers only swim with their age group. A lifeguard is present during swim time. Campers do not have to swim. Our lake has a designated swim area that is treated and has sand on the bottom to help eliminate yucky mud on the lake floor. Campers can only swim in the designated area.
